This year one of the twelve finalists is from Bridgewater, New Jersey; her name is Diana Patton. Her picture book is CHARLEMAGNE TO THE RESCUE, about a small goldfish who builds up his self- esteem by helping his friends and even helps them adjust to an exciting new situation. Usually the finalist authors are paired with illustrators, but since Diana Patton is both author and artist, she figures she has to work twice as hard to obtain votes!
